Play Dough


NOVEMBER—BROWN (WITH CINNAMON SCENT) PLAY DOUGH Stevenson

RECIPE:

3 Cups Flour 3/4 Cup Salt 2 Cups Water (1 ½ - 2 Cups) 1-2Tbs Cinnamon

3 Tbs. vegetable oil (NO peanut or nut oils)

4) Pour 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ Cups of the water into the dry ingredients and mix with a spoon. Adjust water and flour working the dough until the color is uniform and feels like playdough

Dear CHUM Families,

I can hardly believe we are heading into our third month of school! November seems like just the time to tell you how very thankful the board and I are for our families at CHUM! Thanks to all who assist in providing a wonderful preschool experience and for the opportunity to spend time with your child.

This month, we will focus on safety, families and Thanksgiving. A colored paper 'turkey feather' will arrive home soon to be decorated with family members using any materials you have readily available. Please send the feather back to school to dress up our classroom turkey. I will begin taking attendance using the children's last names, (they enjoy being addressed as "Mister" or "Miss"). The pretend play area will be transformed into a pizzeria and fire station so we can try on the roles of pizza chef and fire fighter coordinating with this months field trips. Our class cooking will take place at Mancino's.

With the cooler temperatures coming, we will go out each day weather permitting. Please send the appropriate outside clothing and assist your child in learning how to put on (& zip) their coat, hat and gloves. Perhaps your preschooler can show you our 'up and over' trick, it works every time!

- *Please be sure to LOCK and CHECK both classroom doors and the exterior door every time you exit or enter to keep everyone SAFE.



Preschool and Yoga, and Reindeer! Oh My!

Come check out CHUM's Multi-age Preschool Class! CHUM has started a multi-age preschool experience for children ages 2-5.

Cost is \$7 per child. On Monday November 11 from 1-3pm

Mrs. Huberty will be leading a class with two special visitors! A yoga teacher from Santosha Wellness will be guiding the children through a yoga session. Towards the end of class there will be a visit from a live reindeer from the Reindeer Ranch!!!

While the children are enjoying class, the parents will remain on site to share in a discussion led by Rebecca Hernandez, MS, OTR/L, CEIM, the owner of Santosha Wellness. She will be talking about sensory development and beneficial activities from birth to age 5, including sensory challenges and how to provide support when dysregulation occurs. Babes in arms (or carriers) are welcome at no additional cost.

Crossing Midline Starts with Brooms and Rakes!

At CHUM, we do a lot of activities for Crossing the Midline. Here is an explanation as to why it is necessary for the development of our preschoolers.

Crossing the midline means that the two sides of the brain are working together in activity and is first expressed through gross motor movements. Movements such as erasing the chalkboard, wiping off a table, sweeping the floor, raking leaves, or reaching across the center of the body for passing/retrieving objects are perfect, everyday activities that encourage crossing the midline. Young children are one step closer to forming shapes, symbols, and letters such as a plus sign (+), x, N, and t when they use their hands and arms across the body in functional, gross motor activities. Gross motor development supports the fine motor development of young children!

Two wonderful crossing the midline activities mentioned above are sweeping the floor and raking leaves - children love to be big helpers! But please remember, the perfectly swept floor or impeccable pile of leaves is not the goal when young children sweep and rake. Rather, it is

understanding that the physical process of crossing the midline activities facilitates high-level brain development needed for performing the skill of handwriting!
