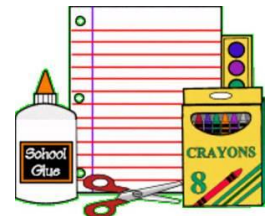

Peanut Allergy Alert

CHUM attendance has included children with life-threatening food allergies. The allergic reactions can be severe and life threatening. In an effort to keep our CHUM environment safe, we ask all parents to follow these guidelines: No peanuts, peanut products or products containing traces of peanuts or tree nuts are allowed at CHUM.

- Avoid feeding your child peanuts or any nut butters before coming to CHUM. If you do, wash hands and wipe mouth thoroughly—this is crucial.

Head Lice Checks

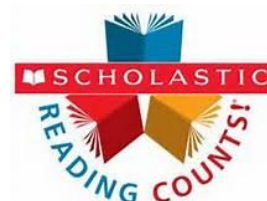

Dear 3's Families,

You will find the 3's classroom a busy place to play, learn and grow! This school year will be one of many exciting discoveries. Through a variety of hands-on activities and play, I look forward to developing a relationship with you and your child.

This month we will focus on making new friends and learning their first names, the sense of touch and types of transportation. On Thursday, September 19th, a PAWS With A Cause puppy in training will visit our classroom. We will find out the importance of the puppy's vest and what some future helping jobs might be. Let me know if your child has a fear of dogs so I can reassure your child and help them to feel safe during the visit. The PAWS With A Cause organization has a list of needed items if you are able help thank them for their time with a donation. For the 4's

Dear 4's Families:

What an exciting year we have ahead welcoming our new and returning students to 4-year-old preschool. This month we'll talk about our five senses, apples and transportation. We will use many different types of materials to develop & strengthen our small and large muscles this year. Your child will use scissors, paintbrushes, crayons, markers, hole punches, puzzles, etc. to help develop the small muscles of their hands. In addition, many opportunities will support large motor development such as scarf dancing, ball tossing, hula-hoops, balance beams, outdoor play, etc. Rounding out the preschool experience your child will have the freedom to explore dramatic play, creative play, stories, songs and science exploration. We will also introduce letters throughout the year. Please note this is only an introduction to their sound as we make the children aware of letters and the role that letters play in our world. The most important letters to each child are the letters in their own name. What busy days we will have!

Starting later in September, I will be sending home "Little Bear". Our class bear will go home with each child for a few nights. Little Bear has a picture directory of all of our classmates, books to read and some questions to answer in our journal. Please be sure to return Little Bear on the correct day so the next anxious child can take him home. Little Bear loves Preschoolers!!

We will also take turns with the Sharing Bag. There will be a theme in the bag for sharing. Please return the bag on our next class day and limit the items in the Sharing Bag to two items. Thanks!

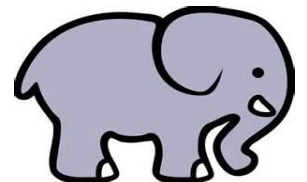

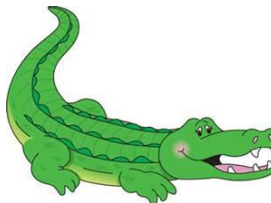

Play Dough

SEPTEMBER—BLUE PLAY DOUGH

RECIPE:

3 Cups Flour
2 Cups Water (1 ½ - 2 Cups)
3 Tbs. vegetable oil (NO peanut or nut oils)

¾ Cup Salt
3 Packets Kool-Aid

- 1) Mix the flour, the salt, and the Kool-Aid together.
- 2) Add the oil to the dry ingredients
- 3) Boil the water
- 4) Pour 1 ½ Cups of the water into the dry ingredients and mix with a spoon. Adjust water and flour working the dough until the color is uniform and feels like playdough.
